with, which makes the construction phase very enjoyable.”

The new church boasts a modern, clean design, with an exterior featuring red brick and beige stone accents. The 26,000-square-foot building includes a large sanctuary, roomy main entry hall and gathering space, pastor’s offices, Sunday school classrooms and storage space, kitchen facilities, and a parking lot to accommodate the congregation’s growing membership. A trio of specially designed stained glass windows complements the sanctuary.



The PRC has a long history in the region. Established in 1926 with just seven families, the church was located in Lansing, Ill., for many years. The original church

had no basement, no plumbing, and was heated by a coal burner. The PRC recently sold facilities in South Holland to finance the building of its new, larger Crete location.

“We’ve worked with the Protestant Reformed Church on many

projects and it’s always a satisfying experience,” says Albertson. “We’re proud of the track record we’ve built together.”

In addition to this latest church, The Hamstra Group has built religious structures, school, and associated facilities for numerous clients.
